Here are a few course care reminders to ensure pristine playing conditions on your golf course. Please repair pitch marks on the greens, use the sand/ seed for divot replacement, rake the bunkers when you finish, and keep carts at least 50' away from greens and bunkers. Please remember rakes should be left **outside** of the bunkers instead of placed inside the bunkers. This positioning will eliminate your golf ball from remaining on the downslope of a bunker.

# Tee Times

# Tee Times / Call in Procedures

Tee times are required all day every day. Members can make tee times for Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday 48 hours in advance. Spouses can make tee times for Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday 24 hours in advance. Tee times are made by phone, in person, or through the webpage starting at 9:00 a.m. To make a tee time by telephone, you must call 303-233-**0503.** For Saturday, Sunday, and holiday times, there will be a lottery drawing at 7:15 a.m. each Thursday. To be included in the lottery drawing, submit an email request via the website, or call the Golf Pro Shop Staff anytime during the week prior to the 7:15 a.m. Thursday drawing. Check with the Golf Pro Shop Staff if you have any questions.

# Procedure:

- One Member will be the captain of the foursome and submit an entry via the webpage by 7:15 a.m. on Thursday morning, with up to four names of the group. The captain will request a desired tee time and give a range, after and before a certain time.
- 2. If you have a twosome or threesome, leave the vacant spots open and the Golf Pro Shop Staff will fill in twosomes and threesomes.
- 3. Singles wanting to play should submit their entry and indicate their preferred time. They will be filled in, as close as possible, with an open group.
- 4. Twosomes and threesomes are allowed to request tee times with the same privileges as foursomes, however, these groups will be filled in with other twosomes or singles.

# Lakewood Country Club Golf Dress Code - 2017

The dress code is designed to maintain the appropriate atmosphere that is acceptable for golf and Lakewood Country Club. Management has the responsibility to enforce that the standards of neat and clean clothing that is ironed or pressed are met at all times. The following descriptions must be adhered to by Members, their families, and their guests.

# All Golf Areas – Golf Course, Driving Range, Practice Area, and Putting Greens

### Men

- Collared or mock necked shirts are acceptable
- All shirts must be tucked in with the exception of full-button camp shirts
- Golf trousers or appropriate length shorts
- All caps must be worn properly with bill facing forward
- Jeans/Denim, workout attire, cargo pants/ shorts, or baggy shorts of any kind are NOT permitted.

### Women

- Blouse tops or golf shirts sleeveless must have collar or mock
- Appropriate length shorts/skirt/skort or slacks
- Halter/Tube/Tank tops and tops showing an individual's midriff are not permitted
- Jeans/Denim, workout attire, cargo pants/ shorts, or baggy shorts of any kind are NOT permitted

### Juniors

Juniors should follow the same dress code as adults

Lakewood is a spikeless facility and appropriate shoes must be worn at all times. Flip Flop shoes are inappropriate for all golf areas.

# turf talk



Welcome back to Turf Talk and the Club, if you have been away for the winter months. A great way to keep up is to check https:// lakewoodccturf. wordpress.com/ anytime or log

into the club website, select golf and scroll to the bottom of the tab and select Turf Talk. You will find information on our plan for the week, (which is good to know when scheduling a scotch or other match), see recent precipitation, course and staff information and anything unusual happening on the course project wise, informative video links, among other items. You probably already know the 18T project is completed, since you have been following the Turf Talk link. The new tees will open when the turf is well rooted. Other items worked on during the off-season were regular tree trimming, bunker restoration on select holes, south pump house waterfall motor and pump refurbishing, small bridge replacement by 6 gold tee, lots of winter watering, shrub and tree additions

around the course, along with normal winter course accessory refurbishing.

We will also be constructing another temporary nursery for the Master Plan greens that will be located behind 16 green. This is where you will find the aeration plugs being spread out to grow a grass similar to the existing greens, just like the other nursery. Since we are reusing the same sod for the new greens, between the removal of sod from existing greens to laying it nearby and replacing back on when complete and all that cutting, you will lose sq. ft. When the project is over, we will return it to its original state.

As a reminder, all our favorite time is coming up, as alluded to above... **AERATION.** The scheduled dates are April 3, 4 and 5th, weather permitting. As always, the Golf Pro Shop will post a note on Foretees on the aeration progress, or give them a call and check the status on Wednesday, in case of any delays.

# letter from the gm



Off to a great start! The first quarter is almost over for 2017 as I write this letter. The weather to start off this year has been mild to say the least. February,

we recognized the most rounds of golf over the last 8 years since we have utilized Foretees for tracking golf rounds. Lakewood Members & Guests played 760 rounds of golf in February, all facets of the Club benefit financially when we facilitate that much play on the golf course.

March is following the same trend as February. Due to the dryness and mild temperatures, we have had to charge up the irrigation system, and open the snack bar, and bathrooms between hole 6 and hole 11. Normally, we would not consider completing either of these procedures until April, so we are certainly ahead of schedule for the 2017 golf season.

The project on hole 18 is 98% complete, left to finish are some planting of native grasses around the pond and waterfall, and shrubs and trees to promote some ground cover and visual enhancements. The response from the Membership on this project has been extremely positive. It really compliments our course, and adds visual beauty to our finishing hole.

The Master Plan project is well under way! We have secured our funding for the project, as well as the contractor that will work hand in hand with Gil Hanse, the architect to perform the work on the course. Chris Swim has worked several months already to pre-order many of the materials needed to complete the Master Plan. This project will be a sprint – not a lengthy process, once the contractor and architect arrive on site. The schedule of work is to last only 12 weeks, the goal is to have all the new planting of sod completed by November 1st, allowing for the entire winter season to take root.

April marks the start of our new dining Menu's at Lakewood. James Klein and Chef Mat are working with some fresh new ideas to entice the Members to frequent the dining room, patio's, pool, and bar. We have a goal to achieve; we want Lakewood Country Club to be in the top 3 places to spend the bulk of your time: home, work, and Lakewood CC, not necessarily in that order. We know that the culinary offerings will play a vital role in achieving that goal. Paired with the new menu; is our never-ending process through training, of increasing the levels of service, in all aspects of the Club.

To sum up the first quarter; it has been a very busy start to 2017. On a different note: Tim Lollar, Lakewood Country Club's Director of Golf, announced his retirement late February. Tim, worked for Lakewood as Director of Golf for the last 17 years, and certainly provided us with "Premier Facility" levels of service, in many cases on a shoestring budget. He has left big shoes to fill, and we have promoted Ben Honaman as Head Professional, to pick up where Tim has left off. I am proud of the way Ben has performed to this point, and I feel he will be a strong asset for Lakewood and the Membership.

I am excited for the opportunities we are faced with this year, and I hope you are all excited as well! It's a great time to be a Member of Lakewood Country Club, the changes you will see happening this year, are a sample of how the Board and the various Committees are preparing us for the future, and to continue the traditions of our storied past.
