letter from the president



I am pleased to report that the number of golf rounds this year continues to outpace every year since we began recording these statistics. The combination of early warmth,

a full Membership, and a robust lineup of tournaments is contributing to our early season success. Record rounds can be a blessing and a curse at the same time, however. The blessing is obvious; we are using our Club and course at the highest level, while creating new friendships and spending our leisure time the way we all enjoy.

The negatives are full tee times, pace of play, and wear and tear on the golf course. As Members, we can control the pace of play and the general wear on the golf course. The pace of play policy at LCC is to keep up with the group in front of you. This policy allows groups throughout the day to tee off on time so that our Members and guests are not inconvenienced with tee time delays. We can minimize the wear on the golf course if we are diligent in fixing divots on the greens, filling divots on the fairways, and raking bunkers with the same care that you would expect the players in front of you to use. And of course, always listen to the golf professionals who are trying to manage the pace of play. From time to time, they have the unenviable task of asking a group to catch up with the group in front of them. They are looking out for the entire Membership and should be regarded as a resource to help your round be as enjoyable as possible.

I want to thank the over 60 volunteers who donated their time last month to repair our greens after one of the strongest hail storms Lakewood has ever

experienced. Their efforts were invaluable in helping get the golf course ready for play so quickly after the storm.

I would also like to thank Chris Swim and his team. They began working on the course as soon as the hail and rain stopped. Chris's experience and hard work made the course playable within 36 hours of the storm. His dedication to our course, as well as his overall experience and skill level, is exemplary.

As the year progresses, we are drawing closer to our Master Plan implementation. Construction will begin August 15. I want to emphasize that the course WILL NOT BE CLOSED. Total Turf has an excellent plan that will minimize disruption of the course. I believe we will have a full 18 holes, with one or two temporary greens, through Labor Day Weekend. This project will be completed on time and on budget, just as the number 18 project was earlier this year. When Total Turf finalizes their disruption/construction plan, we will share that information with everyone. It will be exciting to watch this once in a generation transformation of our already incredible golf course.

The first day of summer is right around the corner, and the Golf Committee is hard at work planning several fun opportunities to compete in nontraditional formats. I hope everyone can participate in one or more of these events.

As our friend, Tony Veto, says, "LET'S GO!" That could mean play faster, or let's meet at the bar or the pool. The point is to use the Club, enjoy yourself, and have a great time. See you around the Club!

letter from the head golf pro

Course

As we enter our busy months, the course will get maximum usage. Here are a few reminders to help keep the course in prime condition: (1) sand/seed mix is provided on your carts, please fill your divots and any others, (2) rake the bunkers when you exit, (3) please be aware of wet conditions when driving carts, (4) do not drive within 50 feet of the greens, and finally, we absolutely have the best putting greens and to maintain these conditions, we need the Membership to **please repair any ball marks on the putting surfaces.**

Safety

We would like to remind the Membership of specific safety areas: (1) please wait for players to leave the cart parking areas on holes #2, #7, #9, and #17, (2) do not hit driving range balls over the fence, and (3) serious injury can occur by driving up to #12 via the cart path coming down from #6 tee. **Also, the player is responsible for any damages occurring within or outside the Lakewood Country Club boundaries.** This includes windshields on 6th Avenue.

Scotch:

The second round of the Scotch matches are about complete and third round matches start on June 8th. Starting at the round of 16, matches will be posted on the message board; so, you may participate in the gallery of "Scotch Watchers". We would like to remind the Membership that carts for Scotch watchers will be available (if there is no Member play scheduled). **If we have scheduled tee times, players have first priority for golf carts.** Please check in with the Golf Pro Shop. Good luck to all participants.

Lightning Policy

Lakewood Country Club subscribes to a local weather alert system that warns us of ground lightning strikes within five miles and impending storms.

When we receive weather alerts, the Golf Pro Shop staff will sound a series of three short blasts on the sirens to signal the **mandatory closure** of the course. When you hear these sirens, you must mark your golf ball and immediately proceed to the nearest shelter. Our staff will assist any walkers who wish to return to the Clubhouse. Once the danger has passed, one long blast will signal the course is "safely" available for play.

Dress Code - 2017

We would like to inform the Membership of the Lakewood Country Club dress code. In an attempt to become more in tune with some of today's fashions, yet, maintain the level of respectability that our traditions warrant, please adhere to the following:

- All men's shirts must be tucked in with the exception of full-button camp shirts (Tommy Bahama style).



The Rise of Generation Y

The arrival of 2017 brought many new and exciting challenges and opportunities for the private club industry. Socioeconomic, governmental,

and technological changes are all affecting the industry.

Perhaps most significant is the continuing shift in generational dominance of our workforce and Membership, from Generation X to Generation Y (Millennials). According to the Pew Research Center, Millennials are now the single largest generation in our workforce, accounting for 1 out of 3 American workers and increasing to 3 out of 4 workers by 2025.

Statistics for the Private Club industry are in line with those for the overall workforce. This generational shift in our workforce will have significant effect on our industry. Club Boards and Managers need to understand who these workers (future Members) are, what their attitudes and expectations regarding work, life, and playtime is, and how we create an environment to ensure our future success.

The individual defined as millennials by Pew Research were born between 1981 to 2000. Depending on who's talking, they are described in very different terms, with very different attributes. A recent Time magazine article about millennials was titled the "Me Me Me Generation." But a recent Ernst & Young survey reports that millennials have a very different view of themselves, claiming to be independent, optimistic, hard-working, loyal, tech-savvy, and tolerant. They prefer to call themselves Young Professionals (YoPro's).

So, which is it? Maybe all the above. The only certainty is that they are vastly different from prior generations, and those differences need to be understood and addressed for clubs to be successful in the future, and Lakewood Country Club should be no different!

Here are a few philosophies that Millennials looking for enjoyment and career look for:

- **Attitudes and expectations:** they want a means to an end, work is to provide funding for all their other interests.
- **Managing the expectations:** club leaders need to pay close attention to trends and address these expectations using clear, thoughtful practices.
- **Collaboration:** clubhouse design is paramount in space utilization for strong gathering points, informal, and multi-purpose use.
- **Work-life balance:** the Millennial mantra is "work hard, play harder".
- **Communication:** they want to feel connected.


