## president's letter

I want to express my gratitude for my fellow continuing Directors: Bill Pruter, Mike Potestio, Jake Jacobson, Peter Urquhart, and Tim Brooks. I would also

like to welcome and congratulate our three new Directors: Mike Margonie, Danette Reagan, and Tom Piercy. This year's LCC Annual Meeting had a very strong turn-out and the election was full of surprises as usual, including a tie and an ensuing run-off. A special thank you to all candidates who took the time and effort to run, and the election judges who had their hands full with this year's ballot count. Needless to say, I am very excited about this year's BOD!

I am equally as excited about our General Manager, Lance Scheele, and his staff. Lance has done a spectacular job as GM since taking over three years ago. Lance, with his strong knowledge of private club management and trends in the industry as well as his particular specialty in F&B Management, has assembled a high quality, stable staff made up of a mix of very tenured professionals, and top new talent appropriate for our Club. Please reach out to Lance and the staff and let them know your appreciation as well as how they can be even more helpful going forward.

As most of you know, we made tremendous progress under Mark's leadership during his past three years on the Board and especially last year while he was President. Mark very humbly added significant value to our Club in some areas that are very visible, as well as in areas not so visible. Please thank him for his service to our Club when you have a chance.

2016 represents simultaneously, tremendous opportunity, and challenge. We have the wind at our back in many ways, with a strong financial position, a full and active Membership, a great golf course, a Clubhouse and pool area we can all enjoy, and a full summer on the horizon to partake in all of the above.

ideally, build a Waiting List. Although we have the demographic winds at our back with our spectacular location vs. downtown Denver and surrounding areas, Member referrals remain, as always, our best source of new Members so please keep them coming!

As I look out toward 2016, I remain very excited about LCC's future and I know our Membership, young and old, are just as excited as I am. The Board, the staff, and I will strive to make 2016 an enjoyable year and continue to move LCC forward in a responsible, responsive manner that takes both tradition and progress very seriously into consideration. As always, the BOD and associated Committees welcome your input on our very special Club centered perfectly between metro downtown Denver and the gateway to the Rockies!

Here are a few course care reminders to ensure pristine playing conditions on your golf course. Please repair pitch marks on the greens, use the sand/seed for divot replacement, rake the bunkers when you finish, and keep carts at least 50' away from greens and bunkers. Please remember rakes should be left **outside** of the bunkers instead of placed inside the bunkers. This positioning will eliminate your golf ball from remaining on the downslope of a bunker.

**Tee Times**

**Tee Times / Call in Procedures**

Tee times are required all day every day. **Members** can make tee times for Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday 48 hours in advance. **Spouses** can make tee times for Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday 24 hours in advance. Tee times are made by phone, in person, or through the webpage starting at 9:00 a.m. **To make a tee time by telephone, you must call 303-233-0503.** For Saturday, Sunday, and holiday times, there will be a lottery drawing at 7:15 a.m. each Thursday. To be included in the lottery drawing, submit an email request via the website, or call the Golf Pro Shop Staff anytime during the week prior to the 7:15 a.m. Thursday drawing. Check with the Golf Pro Shop Staff if you have any questions.

**Procedure:**

- 1) One Member will be the captain of the foursome and submit an entry via the webpage by 7:15 a.m. on Thursday morning, with up to four names of the group. The captain will request a desired tee time and give a range, after and before a certain time.
- 2) If you have a twosome or threesome, leave the vacant spots open and the Golf Pro Shop Staff will fill in twosomes and threesomes.
- 3) Singles wanting to play should submit their entry and indicate their preferred time. They will be filled in, as close as possible, with an open group.
- 4) Twosomes and threesomes are allowed to request tee times with the same privileges as foursomes, however, these groups will be filled in with other twosomes or singles.

**Hole-In-One Club – All Members Are Included**

**\$3.00 entry**  
**Tradition says that if you have a Hole-In-One, you purchase a drink for everyone!** To make sure you don't have a substantially large bar tab, every Member is now required to be in the Hole-In-One club. The Member who makes a hole-in-one is required to report the shot to the Golf Pro Shop Staff. All male Members who are enrolled in the Hole-in-One club, and are present on the day the ace was made, are entitled to a complimentary drink in the Men's Locker Room. Female Members are entitled to a complimentary drink in the Lounge. **All Members are now enrolled in the Hole-in-One Club.** All monies remaining after buying drinks will be credited to the Member's account that had the hole-in-one.

**A Reminder To Your Guests!!**

Please inform your guests before they arrive that Lakewood Country Club is a spikeless facility. Please allow an extra 20 minutes for our staff to change your guest's spikes. Also, please review the dress code policy and inform your guests in advance about proper attire at LCC. **As a Member, your responsibility includes your guest's behavior and adherence to the dress code. In particular, shirts must be tucked in and cargo shorts / pants are prohibited.**

**Lakewood Country Club  
Golf Dress Code - 2016**

The dress code is designed to maintain the appropriate atmosphere that is acceptable for golf and Lakewood Country Club. Management has the responsibility to enforce that the standards of neat and clean clothing that is ironed or pressed are met at all times. The following descriptions must be adhered to by Members, their families, and their guests.

**All Golf Areas – Golf Course,  
Driving Range, Practice Area,  
and Putting Greens**

**Men**

- Collared or mock necked shirts are acceptable
- All shirts must be tucked in with the exception of full-button camp shirts
- Golf trousers or appropriate length shorts
- All caps must be worn properly with bill facing forward
- Jeans/Denim, workout attire, cargo pants/shorts, or baggy shorts of any kind are NOT permitted.

**Women**

- Blouse tops or golf shirts – sleeveless must have collar or mock
- Appropriate length shorts/skirt/skort or slacks
- Halter/Tube/Tank tops and tops showing an individual's midriff are not permitted
- Jeans/Denim, workout attire, cargo pants/shorts, or baggy shorts of any kind are NOT permitted

**Juniors**

Juniors should follow the same dress code as adults

Lakewood is a spikeless facility and appropriate shoes must be worn at all times. **Flip Flop shoes are inappropriate for all golf areas.**

**Men's And Ladies' Lockers**

Currently, there are a limited number of men's and ladies' lockers available. If you would like to have a locker, please speak to Jim or the Golf Pro Shop Staff.

**Golf Pro Shop – Driving Range Hours**

As we enter our peak golf season, the Golf Pro Shop will open ½ hour prior to the first tee time and close approximately an hour before sunset. Morning tee times and the opening of the driving range are determined by frost conditions. Please call the Golf Pro Shop Staff to verify early morning starting times.

**Guest Restrictions**

Starting May 1st, the following guest restrictions are in effect:

**Tuesday through Friday** – Three guests per Member before 11:00 a.m. and after 1:00 p.m. One guest per Member between 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.

Certainly we gain some perspectives from our various Committees' and Board of Directors; we look at the past year's performance and focus on our shortcomings in each department both financially and from a service initiative. My goal is to have each Director have a clear, desired outcome for the upcoming season. Everyone needs goals and a target to work towards; just repeating last year is not enough to inspire the team leaders.

### First we must hire the right people!

Turnover in our industry is a constant, so when we hire, we must be diligent in our process to bring in the right minded people, or we end up hiring someone with just a pulse, and that is the last employee we want to service our Membership. Training needs to be implemented and followed through, and not just throwing a new employee into the fire! While we ramp up for the season, rest assured we can achieve a much better product through training when volume is low (winter season), versus waiting too late when we are already in full swing.

returning Pros for 2016. Currently, we have hired three people that we feel will be a true asset to this division. We hired a full time Merchandiser, her name is Mary Kate Morency and she comes to us with some fantastic experience in sports marketing. We have hired two new full time Assistant Professionals, Ethan Malzhan and Jeff Corona. Both of these young men come with a tremendous amount of experience as well as training through the PGA. With these three individuals coming on board, I expect better service levels from last year.

The Facilities Department, which is the housekeeping and maintenance division for the Clubhouse and pool building, are under the Direction of Bob Mosher. We just acquired an individual by the name of Jacque Anderson who has many technical skills as well as a basic construction background to assist Bob with what is now becoming an aging building. Jacque's presence will be noticed with many of the smaller details that to this point have been behind in upkeep due to a lack of manpower and experience. Once again, this will be a marked improvement from 2015.

As is with every summer season, we will have almost an entirely new pool staff. This is the area that is most affected by service year after year due to so much turnover. For 2016, we are hoping to acquire two supervisory positions. The first being an Aquatics Manager, this person will oversee the swim team, swim events, and the lifeguards. The second person will be responsible for the supervision of the Food & Beverage staff, including the kitchen personnel. With multiple supervisors on the pool deck, it will increase our safety as well as service for our pool patrons.

**Enhance the Facilities!** If any of you have played golf lately, I would hope you have noticed the work being completed on hole #7 in front/alongside the teeing ground. The timber retaining wall was failing, so we have designed a "natural" looking retaining system that is currently under construction. In addition to the retaining wall, we will be adding another tee box to offer more yardage flexibility, and relocating the cart path. Visually this will complete a hole that would parallel the Donald Ross original design.

A pool bar will be constructed that will offer more bar seating from the temporary bar we had in 2015. This new bar will seat between 20 to 24 people, have ample coverage from the elements, and offer television viewing. In addition, the location will offer service for both the pool patrons as well as golfers heading off to the first tee.

Reposition of the Golf Pros offices is to provide more secure and larger storage for our merchandise inventory. Lakewood CC, during the peak season, carries a large amount of merchandise: clubs, golf bags, and apparel. We needed additional space to ensure security, as well as better inventory control, by switching

out the spaces from 2015. In making this switch, we hope to gain better product controls, bringing additional dollars down to the bottom line.

**Live accountability!** Part of our Management philosophy at Lakewood CC, is to coach and instill with every team member, accountability. Once again this year, our Directors, Managers, and front line employees will be charged with holding themselves accountable for our goals in 2016. Service initiatives are discussed daily through routine line-ups with all staff members. Constant reinforcement of service techniques as well as new successful trends we see in the industry is required for us to continue to excel. Education, training, and accountability will play the most important role in a successful winning season.

I look forward to an exciting 2016 golf season, and I hope to see you all very soon!


