Indian Summer

It's old news now, but I wanted to take this opportunity to thank the Membership one last time for their support of the Golf Course

Master Plan. I think that 18 months from now when we first play the golf course with its completed upgrades, it will be a very exciting time for all LCC Members, their families, and guests. Speaking of playing the course, what a gift we were given with this amazing fall weather! It hasn't been just an Indian summer, it has practically been a second summer. Just another amazing benefit of living in Colorado and belonging to LCC!

Golf Course Upgrades

The favorable weather has given our contractors a chance to move quickly and effectively on the upgrades to the water flow control and new tee box on #18 and by the time you see this letter those changes should be 90%+ in place already. We will be able to enjoy this exciting enhancement throughout 2017 and know that the dam and the bridge that were once a concern have been remedied. Of course the Golf Course Master Plan construction won't begin till mid-August of 2017 but Gil's team is already focused and working with Chris Swim, Jake Jacobson, and Lance Scheele on planning. All of our Board Committees have been working hard to minimize the disruption at the end of next year's season as much as possible and I thank the Chairs and their Committee Members for their additional diligence in this area. If it seems there has been an extra concentration in focus on our golf course lately, it is because there has been,

and I believe rightly so. That said, the focus on major upgrades to the golf course will soon come to an end. In approximately 18 months from today, we should be winding up the final touches to all of the major changes and the golf course will be largely finished with significant changes for many years. In 18 months, we will begin to enjoy fully the investment we are making now and the inconveniences of golf course construction will be behind us. Future Boards, Committees, and Members will be able to focus on the other important parts of the Club such as the Clubhouse, pool, and other facilities which tend to require more frequent upgrades.

Money Things

I would imagine most of you are aware that the Board voted in favor of a raise to Lakewood Country Club Membership initiation fees ("i-fees") from the current \$37,500 to \$42,500 effective April 1, 2017. The Board believes even at the \$42,500 level Lakewood CC offers significant value to those looking to join a private golf club of Lakewood's caliber and location in the Denver area. With the golf course upgrades on the horizon, our Club is even more attractive than ever. Please let anyone you know that has any interest that getting into LCC that NOW is the time!

Finance and Membership Committees along with Mike Leapley, Lance, his staff, and the Board have been working diligently on the 2017 Budget for LCC. As many of you are aware, a budgeting process not only helps with a future view of P&L, it tends to lead to the fine tuning of plans and goals. As in all budget processes, there are typically sets of expected challenges such as budgeting for staff compensation and size, or dealing with increasingly meaningful depreciation on our now 11-year-old-Clubhouse. There are also unexpected challenges such as some of those that are hitting us this

year like the new DOL rule on hourly employees, the new Colorado minimum wage law, and Denver's extremely tight labor market (particularly in services). Despite this annual ritual, past LCC Boards have always been able to keep monthly dues to a very reasonable rate and that history illustrates itself in the fact that LCC is right toward the bottom of the list on total required monthly fees amongst Denver-based private golf and country clubs yet we are still able to provide our Members with exceptional service across the board. We've been in a very strong financial position for several years, including this year, and we would like to continue that tradition and at the same time deliver an experience that members of a private club such as LCC should expect.

Just a very speedy tutorial at an extremely high level on LCC P&L for those that are new and/or those that haven't stopped to read the LCC financials; the Club currently generates slightly over \$8MM/year in revenues, and a similar amount in overall expenses and costs. Revenue from Membership line items (dues & i-fees basically) make up about half of all revenues, but i-fees are unpredictable and, arguably, should not even be a P&L line item. Required monthly dues including house fees, which are much more predictable, make up approximately 42% of our revenue. F&B revenue comprises around 30% of Club revenue with about 10% of that from banquet-related F&B. Golf-related revenue (including Monday tournaments and locker revenue) comprises close to 20% of Club revenue. On the expense side, payroll overall makes up about 41% of Club expenses with F&B payroll carrying the lions share at 16% of Club expenses. Direct materials cost of sales are about 13% of Club expenses. Non-payroll, non-direct-material expenses make up about 43% of total expenses. Of course, this summary is at the 60,000-

foot level but I think that is a helpful perspective at times as we are all very busy. The gory details are constantly monitored by Mike Leapley our CFO and his staff, Lance, and, of course, the Finance Committee headed up this year by Bill Pruter and, ultimately the Board.

2017 Board and Committee Planning

In addition to planning the budget for the coming year, the Board and its Nominating Committee, headed by immediate Past President, Mark Wehrle, are just now embarking on planning next year's BOD composition. By the time you read this, a new President and set of Committee Chairs for 2017 should have been selected and will take over from the 2016 BOD at the LCC Annual Meeting in February where we hope to see as many Members as possible. We will likely still be searching for candidates to run for the BOD of which 3 new Board Directors will be voted in by the Membership at the Annual Meeting. If you are interested in running for the Board or even just sitting on a Committee, please talk to Mark, myself, or anyone on the BOD and we will put your name in front of the Nominating Committee or let the Committee Chair of whatever Committee you are interested in, know of your interest.

As you can see LCC remains a very busy place, even during the winter months!

Despite some cold weather heading our way, I hope I see you around the Club, and **don't forget to keep those new Member referrals coming our way! Get your friends in before April!**

There are a few important course care items that the Members can help with to maintain the conditions throughout the winter, and more importantly, to allow for premier early spring conditions. Cart traffic is one of the main problems our course faces during the winter season. First, please keep carts on paths at all times whenever possible and follow all roped areas. Second, keep the carts at least 60 feet from tees and avoid driving near the edges of bunkers. Third, when leaving a green, be careful and walk away from the edges of the bunkers to avoid creating a wear pattern. Fourth, please utilize the sand/seed mixture provided to fill divots on the course and practice area. Finally, please make sure to fix ball marks on the greens. I'm sure everyone recognizes and is proud of our course conditions. As we all know, the winter treatment has a direct impact on our spring conditions.

Bathrooms and water fountains located on the course are closed for the winter months. Water stations will be available behind the driving range as well as the #11 Snack Bar. For any food and beverage needs, orders may be placed at the Pike's Peak Lounge or call the Golf Pro Shop.

The holiday shopping season is upon us and we would like to invite you to visit the Golf Pro Shop for any of

complimentary gift-wrapping for your purchases. The festivities are scheduled from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.





rules amendment

Attention Lakewood Members-

The Board of Directors at the November Board Meeting, instituted a change in Article 1, Section 3, pertaining to late fees and chronic delinquency.



Article 1

Section 3. Payment for Members' monthly statements is due to the accounting office by the last day of the month following the date of the statement. A Member becomes delinquent on the first day of the following month. A \$100.00 late fee will be assessed on this day. If the past due portion of a Member's account has not been paid by the 15th of the month, an additional \$200.00 late fee will be assessed. If a Member is again late within six months from the date of the first late fee assessed above (including continued non-payment of the bill that initially triggered a late fee), then in that event the late fee shall be \$200.00 if not paid on the first day of the following month, and an additional late fee of \$300.00 will be charged if not paid by the 15th day of the month. If the Member is late for a third time within six months following the second late period, then in that event that Member shall be assessed a \$500.00 late fee. Notwithstanding the above, a Member who is delinquent in his or her account twice during any six month period shall be considered to be in chronic delinquency status. A chronically delinquent Member may be subject to disciplinary action in accordance with Article X of the By-Laws. Please refer to the By-Laws, article IX, section 3 and 4, for further detail on the policy regarding delinquency.
