Olympics / Hanse

Summer Olympics, what a special spectacle of competition we get to enjoy every four years. As I write this, the 2016 summer Olympics are winding down

and we've all been able to enjoy our fair share of swimming, gymnastics, volleyball, track & field, ping-pong (the Chinese are crazy good at ping-pong!), and...golf??... Golf returned to the Olympics after a 112 year absence. It is exciting to have golf back in the Olympics albeit in a very plain-vanilla format of 72-hole stroke play, no money (of course), and just your basic individual gold, silver, and bronze medals for each of the Men's competition and the Women's competition. Simple, just like the rest of the Olympic events. What wasn't so simple was getting there, as Rio didn't even have a golf course to hold the event on when it was selected to host the 2016 Olympic Games back in October of 2009. This meant that a golf course had to be built from scratch. In early 2012, Gil Hanse was the unlikely designer selected to build the Rio de Janeiro Olympic Golf Course. It is a fascinating story that, for anyone who is interested there are some great documentary articles and videos (Sports Illustrated, Golf Channel, ESPN, NBC, etc.) on how Gil won the contract and on the design and construction of the course. I feel like the most amazing part of it was the competition that Gil beat. A paragraph from a Sports Illustrated article sums it up:

Hanse, 53, was the surprise choice for the Olympic Golf Course project, his Gil Hanse Golf Design company beating out industry heavyweights such as Jack

Nicklaus, Greg Norman, Gary Player, Martin Hawtree, Robert Trent Jones Jr., Peter Thomson and Tom Doak.

To be sure, Hanse wasn't an "unknown" by any means, having built/renovated/restored some of the best courses in the world (with a specialty in Donald Ross restorations), including Winged Foot, Southern Hills, etc. Hanse has always had ties to Colorado and has recently completed some significant work at DCC and, as most LCC Members know, he is the designer of our Master Plan. With great foresight, LCC was the first club to hire Gil when he started his own firm back in 1994, a fact that Gil often mentions in interviews. If golf course design interests you at all, I would highly recommend Gil's website: <http://www.hansegolfdesign.com/>

At its August 18th meeting, the LCC Board of Directors voted to call a Special Meeting of Voting Members for Thursday, October 6, 2016. The meeting will start at 6:00 p.m. The purpose of the meeting is to vote on a proposal to refinance LCC's existing debt and re-borrow a portion of amounts previously paid off, for the purpose of completing the Golf Course Master Plan. No assessment would be required. If you plan to attend the Special Meetings, please call 303-233-4614 with your reservation.

The Master Plan was approved by the Membership in 2007. Since then some of the Master Plan work has been done, primarily bunkers and tees. By now, you should be seeing posters and other materials in the Clubhouse, showing the golf course work that would be done, the timeline, project costs, and financing proposal. In addition, information packets are available for pick up in


