letter from the head golf pro



Course:

As we enter our busy months, the course will get maximum usage. Here are a few reminders to help keep the course in prime condition: 1) sand/seed mix is provided

on your carts, please fill your divots and any others, 2) rake the bunkers when you exit, 3) please be aware of wet conditions when driving carts, 4) do not drive within 50' of the greens, and finally, we absolutely have the best putting greens and to maintain these conditions, we need the Membership to please repair any ball marks on the putting surfaces.

Safety:

We would like to remind the Membership of specific safety areas: 1) please wait for players to leave the cart parking areas on holes #2, #7, #9, and #17, 2) do not hit driving range balls over the fence, 3) serious injury can occur by driving up to #12 via the cart path coming

down from #6 tee. Also, the player is responsible for any damages occurring within or outside the **Lakewood Country Club boundaries.**

This includes windshields on 6th Avenue.

Scotch:

The first round of Scotch matches are about complete and the second round matches start on June 15th. Starting at the round of 16, matches will be posted on the message board; so, you may participate in the gallery of "Scotch Watchers". We would like to remind the Membership that carts for Scotch watchers will be available (if there is no Member play scheduled). If we have scheduled tee times, players have first priority for golf carts. Please check in with the Golf Pro Shop. Good luck to all participants.

Junior Golf

The 2018 Junior Golf Program will begin on June 6th and 7th. On Wednesday mornings, the golf course will be available after 9:45 a.m. for our Members. **Reminder** – We would like to remind our Juniors they are not allowed on the driving range from 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on the weekdays.

Handicaps

The restoration of LCC is going to have an impact on the course rating for handicap purposes and the allocation of strokes in the course of a match. Here are the steps we are taking to address both these issues:

- 1. Course Rating: Once the restoration was completed last fall, the Colorado Golf Association visited LCC and GPSed the entire course to understand the affects the restoration had on yardages. While yardage is an important factor in slope rating, it is not the only element. The rating process cannot be completed until the new course is available for play. The CGA will be back to re rate the golf course in mid-June.
- 2. Stroke Allocation: A more difficult issue, and one where we will need all the Members help, is the allocation of stroke holes. The USGA provides a guideline for determining stroke holes that has as its foundation the collection of actual results from 200 to 500 rounds. In order to do this and support early season play, we will be doing the following:

We are asking each group to turn in their scorecard to the Golf Pro Shop. On each card, we will need the player's full name and what tees were played. This will allow the Golf Pro Shop staff to input the individual hole results into a database of rounds that will act as a guideline for the allocation of stroke

holes. Details of the player/tees played is to assure that we get a diverse sample of player skill levels.

Once we have accumulated a representative sample of cards in the database, the Handicap Committee will make a recommendation to the Golf Committee on the stroke allocations for the restored course.

We want to thank you in advance for helping in this effort and ask that you turn in legible cards with all the required information.

Pace Of Play

We would like to thank the Membership for following the pace of play guidelines. Most all rounds are now played in four hours or less and with your continued awareness, this expected pace will be maintained throughout the season. Once again, a group's position is directly behind the group in front at all times. If there is a gap, the group must either close the gap, or let faster players through.

When you hear these sirens, you must mark your golf ball and immediately proceed to the nearest shelter. Our staff will assist any walkers who wish to return to the Clubhouse. Once the danger has passed, one long blast will signal the course is "safely" available for play.

Due to the high demand for our tee times during the summer months, if you must cancel your time, please be considerate of your fellow Members and let the Golf Pro Shop staff know as soon as possible.



Now that the course is open, what is next?

On May 12th, the golf course was completely open after just six months from the time Total Turf and Gil Hanse finished the work on the

Golf Course Master Plan restoration. Many of the remarks from the Membership are positive, with the overall sentiment that the golf course has an elevated feel from what it once was. The Membership at LCC is certainly deserving of the experience the new course layout will provide. So now the question is; what's next?

The various Committees under the guidance of the Board, are committed to continue to enhance the services and amenities at LCC. The practice facility is a direct reflection of that commitment. With new amenities along with an individualized touch, the driving range has risen alongside the golf course and is elevated from what it once was as well. New pool furnishings, new golf carts, new scorecards, and hole location sheets are all products and services the Committees along with Management have provided to the Membership this year in an effort to elevate the Member experience of LCC.

Long Range Planning Committee is working on the future of the Clubhouse alongside Facilities Committee to compile information regarding the renovation of the dining room/bar to ensure the desired outcome provides a gathering place for the entire Membership to enjoy for years to come. In addition to the Clubhouse upgrades, the Facilities Committee is also putting together a long-term plan for Capital repairs and replacement items the facility will require over the next 10 years.

Golf Committee had several agenda items to accomplish this year that

Membership will begin to take notice of including; more afternoon events for smaller groups to participate in, Junior Golf's renovated program, and the Handicap system has an increased awareness in monitoring how and when Members are posting scores to maintain fair and equitable Member events.

Programs Committee is striving to establish our annual fundraising Gala, to ensure maximum participation as well as a fair distribution of the funds raised to various charitable organizations. Not to mention they continually work with management to come up with a new social calendar year after year. Pool parties, and smaller events such as Trivia Night, Bar Week, and Ballroom Dancing all come from the discussions out of Programs Committee.

Green Committee is working on the details to put the finishing touches on our restored golf course. Fairway bunkers that were not touched during the Master Plan have now become a focus on when and how we can refurbish them. Additional improvements in the upcoming future will be to "hide" the compost area, so it's not so visible as Members drive up to the 18th tee box. Another item that will see some attention is the retaining wall that starts to impede the cart path as a Member drives toward the 7th green will need to be repaired in the near future. The Committee also reviews with management a tree plan, to ensure the health of the turf on the golf course.

Membership Committee is the lifeblood of any Private Club, and LCC is no different. Over the last two years, this Committee has increased the initiation fees to establish a price point indicative of the product and services a new Member will receive at LCC. 
