letter from the president



October 2018 – The Cost Of Doing Business

As outlined in my September letter, this time of year is when your Board of Directors assess the good, the bad, the needs and the wants

of Lakewood Country Club. Committees have been focused on their financial needs to provide input into Finance Committee as it creates the 2019 budget for LCC. I addressed many items under review such as the needs of our existing Clubhouse, short-term projects such as the snack shack enhancement, and the long-term project of expanded casual dining. The needs of our golf course both short and long-term must always be addressed. We are also reviewing debt reduction while contemplating an increase in monthly dues. Lakewood Country Club is in a strong financial position today with more than adequate cash reserves, a full Membership and a waiting list albeit a short waiting list. This provides flexibility in how we approach balance sheet management and capital expenditures but we must maintain fiscal responsibility even in these good times.

These are good times as reflected in most every financial news headline. One headline everyone understands is the unemployment rate. The headline reads that the US economy is in great shape and unemployment rates are at

historic lows! This is not fake news. But this is not such great news for anyone who owns or runs a business especially the hospitality business. Simply put, the available work force is depleted due to low unemployment which makes hiring new staff that much more difficult and the cost of retaining good staff that much higher. Responses to job postings are down over 60% and, for those who do respond and schedule an interview, less than half actually show up! All of us who own businesses are learning to do more with less and I can assure you our General Manager, Lance Scheele, is operating in this manner. Regardless, our daily operating expenses continue to rise. The traditional model for private clubs allocates 100% of initiation fees towards capital expenditures while monthly dues are to cover monthly operating expenses. LCC does not currently follow this model as a portion of initiation fees collected are applied to daily operating expenses. This works during good times when membership is at capacity and typical membership turnover rates exist but fiscal responsibility would dictate less dependence. The term used to describe this financial structure is "I-Fee Dependence." Long-term fiscal responsibility would look to create LCC as "I-Fee Independent." This need for I-Fee Independence and the increase in labor expense is causing the Membership Committee, Finance Committee, and Board of Directors to consider an increase in monthly dues to be presented at our Annual Meeting in February 2019. For many years, LCC followed a pattern of

increasing monthly dues every three years. This moved to every two years in 2015. In reality, we should manage to annual monthly dues increases in order to effectively manage Club operations while providing a best-in-class membership experience. This does not mean a mandatory annual increase in monthly dues rather, it provides for an environment of annual fiscal analysis whereby an increase in monthly dues can be applied when necessary. By comparison to other private clubs in the Front Range, LCC continues to be on the low-end of the monthly dues scale while providing tremendous value to its Members and families. I am hopeful that thorough analysis and consideration by the aforementioned Committees will provide an appropriate recommendation to our Members in the coming months.

In the meantime, I trust many of you continue to enjoy our beautiful golf course during this fall season. The greens are in tremendous shape, the colors are beautiful, and the cool mornings create a golf experience like few others. We are Members of a wonderful Club and I'm proud when I tell someone that I am a Member at Lakewood Country Club. My thanks to each of you for making our Club great!



Off Season Policies

As of October 1st and continuing through April 30, 2019 guest times are lifted. However, the twice per month guest restrictions are still in effect. The lottery and tee times remain in effect through the off-season. **Gangosomes**

are not in effect until November 1st except by Golf Pro Shop discretion. A gangosome is up to six (6) players in a group. We ask that all gangosomes be respectful to foursomes, allowing them to play through whenever possible. Gangosomes rules in effect- 1) Continuous putting- Each player must continue putting until the ball is holed or the putt is conceded. NO MARKING THE GOLF BALL 2) All players must ride in a gangosome unless course demand is minimal. When joining a group to make 5 or 6, make sure that all players are willing to ride before adding yourself to a group. If you have any questions, please call the Golf Professional staff for assistance.


